Asthma

The School office must be informed if your child has been diagnosed with Asthma. There is a form to be completed at the office and inhalers or pumps should be in school at all times. Please check the dates on your child's medication regularly and replace them as necessary.

Back Gate Opening Times

The back gate, accessed from Frances Road, will be locked between 9am and 3pm. All Nursery drop offs and pickups during this time should be via the main, front gate. All daytime visitors must use the main, front gate.

Be on time for school

Early Years -enter class at 8.45am

Year 1 to 6- gates open from 8.30am

Children can enter class from 8.40am

After 8.50am your child will be marked late (L)

After 9.00am your child will be marked as an unauthorised absence (U)

It is extremely important that you ensure your child is in class before 8.50am as having unauthorised absences will impact their attendance.

Allergies

If your child has an allergy that has been diagnosed by a doctor, you must ensure that school has all the details so that the relevant information can be passed on to the teachers, our school kitchen and the catering suppliers. If your child has an Epipen, make sure the school has one and that it is in date.



Water Bottles



We encourage pupils to bring in a water bottle with a sports type spout or lid. Water bottles should contain just still water, no squash or fizzy drinks. Water bottles should be named and taken home every afternoon to be washed and refilled. We also have facilities to refill the bottles at school.

The Daily Mile Markings On The Key Stage 1 Playground

We have now installed the markings for the Daily Mile which is an initiative which was started in February 2012 by Elaine Wyllie MBE, who was the head teacher of a large Scottish primary school. She was concerned by the children's lack of fitness and introduced The Daily Mile, which proved to be effective in combating inactivity and obesity in her school.

We hope to introduce the Daily Mile to all year groups during this academic year. The Daily Mile is a very simple concept. Every class goes out in the fresh air to run or jog at their own pace for 15 minutes daily or a few times a week. It is not competitive although some will compete and that is fine. Most children will average a mile in the 15 minutes. It is not PE, sport or cross-country but physical activity in a social setting which is aimed at improving the children's physical, social, emotional and mental health, and wellbeing. The children run in their ordinary school clothes with trainers being ideal but not essential. It can help children to focus and concentrate in the classroom making them more ready for learning. And most importantly, we hope the children really enjoy it.

School Houses

Dear Parents and Carers,

I am writing to you with an update of our school house system which was introduced towards the end of the last school year. All stakeholders of the school from children, staff, governors, and parents were asked to vote on the school house names which were all castles in Kent. The four winning castles were Lullingstone, Rochester, Leeds and Hever.

All children and staff have now been put into a school house and each house has a colour; Lullingstone is red, Rochester is blue, Leeds is green, and Hever is yellow. We have also kept siblings in the same houses. We hope at some point in this academic year that we will be able to give each child a plain t-shirt in the colour of their house, so that they can wear it on PE days, intra house competitions and other special events.

Being part of a house, gives the children a feeling of community and team spirit as they are not only working hard towards their own individual achievements, but they are also working towards joint house goals such as sports day and an attendance prize. We will be introducing a variety of intra house competitions throughout the school year.
