Hayfever

If your child requires Hayfever Medication, please make sure you give this to them at home before school.

Water bottles

Please ensure your child has a water bottle in school with them at all times.



Sun Cream and hats

As the weather gets warmer, please ensure your child has a hat with them and apply sun cream to them in the morning before school.



Naming Uniform

Please ensure ALL items of uniform that your child brings in to school is named; we have lots of items lost by children and it is easier to reunite it with its owner if we know who it belongs to!

Uniform Expectations

Further to our letter sent home recently, just a reminder that school uniform should be:

- Burgundy Sweatshirt or Cardigan with School Logo – (Pupils can wear plain items of clothing so long as they are the same colour and style as the logo uniform)
- White Polo T-Shirt
- Grey Trousers, Grey Tunic or Grey Skirt
- Pink /White Summer Dresses or Grey Shorts (Summer Uniform)
- Grey or black socks with trousers/shorts or White / Grey Socks or Tights with skirts/dresses
- School Fleeces (optional) to be worn outside only

- Sturdy Black Shoes -NO slip on shoes or pumps – Black trainers are allowed but they MUST be completely black, anything with coloured logos or white/colourful soles are NOT allowed and your child will be asked to change.
- Hair accessories should match the uniform and not be too large (children will be asked to remove big/elaborate hair accessories).

Compulsory P.E. Kit

Children to wear PE kit on their PE days all day; this should consist of:

- Black trainers or plimsolls
- Plain black joggers/plain black leggings or plain black shorts
- Plain t-shirt in your child's house colour – NO crop tops
- Plain black hoodie or school jumper/cardigan

Children not wearing the correct PE kit will be asked to change into school spare kit

- No Jewellery apart from stud earrings. These need to be removed on PE days.
- Fake nails/nail polish is NOT permitted in school.

At St Paul's Cray we take attendance and punctuality very seriously we have a whole school attendance target of 96%, our whole school attendance currently stands at **92.07%**



Breakdown of current class attendance for the year so far is:

There are things you can do to improve your child's attendance and avoid falling into the persistent absence category:

- Avoid taking any holidays during term times
- Keep up to date with what % attendance your child has so that you know if they are at risk of persistent absence (you can access attendance on the school app)
- Speak to school staff with any concerns. We have our family worker, Mrs Brindle, and each Key Stage has a Phase Leader:
 - EYFS (Nursery and Reception) is Mrs Zegeling
 - KS1 (Year 1 and 2) is Miss Bell
 - o LKS2 (Year 3 and 4) is Mrs Jones
 - UKS2 (Year 5 and 6) is Mrs Merredew
- Talk to your child about the importance of them being in school and let them know how important you feel it is.
- Please ensure your child is on time for school, any child arriving after 8.50am will be marked as late on the register and any after 9am will be marked as U and this is an unauthorised absence for morning registration and will affect your child's attendance percentage

If your child is unwell and you are unsure whether to send them to school, contact the office to report on 01689 821993. School will phone the parents of any children who are absent without reason.
